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About The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors

The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors ('the Institute') was founded in April 1984 and had 85 founder members. The Institute was statutorily incorporated by virtue of the Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors Ordinance in January1990 (Cap. 1148). In July 1991, there was also passed the Surveyors Registration Ordinance (Cap. 417) to set up a Registration Board to administer the registration of surveyors.

The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors is the only professional organisation representing the surveying profession in Hong Kong. The Institute strives to maintain a high professional standard and requirements amongst members including setting standards for professional services and performance, establishing codes of ethics, and determining requirements for admission as professional surveyors. The Institute imposes a mandatory requirement for all members to upgrade skills through continuing professional development.

As a reputable and responsible professional body of surveyors, the Institute has always maintained vigorous assessment standards for entry to the profession and has also maintained high professional and ethical standards of member surveyors, through the various codes of professional practices, the code of ethics, and continuing professional development. The Institute has taken on an important and responsive consultative role in government policy making particularly on issues affecting land, property and construction. The Institute plays an important role from time to time in giving advice to the Government on issues such as unauthorised building works, building safety campaign, problems of property management, town planning and development strategies, construction quality and housing problems.

To qualify as a corporate member of the Institute, surveyors must possess a recognised academic degree or similar qualification, followed by a minimum of 2 years supervised professional experience within strict guidelines, followed by an Assessment of Professional Competence (APC).

The title "Surveyor" embraces a number of disciplines involved with land and its development with land and buildings, covering an extremely wide scope. Some surveyors work in private practices and others may work for a landowner, developer, building contractor or government departments and related bodies.

The Institute consists of six divisions:

- 1. Building Surveying Division
- 2. General Practice Division
- 3. Planning and Development Division
- 4. Quantity Surveying Division
- 5. Land Surveying Division
- 6. Property and Facility Management Division

A land surveyor measures and records the shape and position of the land, defines the boundary and sets out the legal boundaries of the sites. A general practice surveyor advises on the best use of the land, assesses the feasibility and viability of the proposed development project as well as the valuation, marketing, sale, leasing and management of completed developments. A planning and development surveyor further advises on the possible change of zoning, the likely environmental impacts and makes suggestions on preliminary development contents. A quantity surveyor is concerned with the building contractual arrangements and cost control, and will evaluate the likely cost of the development project and advise on the most suitable kind of contract for the project. A building surveyor is involved in the project management of building development proposal, holistic maintenance management of building and overall control of private buildings under relevant legislation. A property and facility management surveyor provides a comprehensive range of services in real estate management.

About The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors

Internationally, the Institute has established and continues to expand its presence in the international scene through participation in various international platforms. Over the years, the Institute has shown its international importance and leading position by playing an important role in participating and joining different international organisations and committees included the World Organisation of Valuation Associations (WAVO), World Organisation of Building Officials (WOBO), Pacific Association of Quantity Surveyors (PAQS), International Federation of Surveyors (FIG), South East Asian Surveyors Congress (SEASC), International Valuation Standard Council (IVSC) etc. In May 2001, Past Chairman of the Quantity Surveying Division, Sr TT Cheung was elected as Chairman of the PAQS for the term 2001 to 2003 at the 5th PAQS Board Meeting. In January 2003, Past President (Council Year 1997/98) Sr WONG Thien Nyen was elected as the Vice President of the FIG Council 2003-2006. The status and reputation of the Institute have been much upgraded through the active participation in these international organisations and events.

Over the years, the Institute had also successfully organised a number of international events in Hong Kong or other countries. Few examples are: in 2000 HKIS co-organised the "Year 2000 Mainland and Hong Kong Conference on Urban Construction and the Environment" in Chongqing; in 2003 HKIS successfully hosted the 7th SEASC Congress in Hong Kong; in 2007 HKIS hosted the FIG Working Week 2007 in Hong Kong. The FIG Working Week was the biggest congress event ever organised by the Institute. The Institute also regularly hosts the Cross Strait Land Conference (兩岸四地土地學術研討會) and the Cross Strait Geometric Conference (海峽兩岸測繪發展研討會).

Besides international participation, the Institute has established reciprocity relationships with other national surveying bodies and through membership in relevant world bodies and international organisations in order to maintain its professional edge at international level. The Institute is one of the 3 founding members, apart from the Singapore Institute of Surveyors and Valuers and the Institution of Surveyors, Malaysia, of the Surveyors' Alliance Asia which was inaugurated in November 2004. The Institute has reciprocal agreements with:

The Institute continues to increase its importance and standing both locally and internationally. Through maintaining both a high professional standard of the institute and the members locally, and keeping in pace with the professional levels internationally, the Institute is marching towards another step ahead of the summit.

About Property and Facility Management Division

Property and Facility Management Division

In the past, those of us from the three main branches of specialisation of the Surveying profession, namely Building Surveying, General Practice, Quantity Surveying, were engaged in property and facility management. In 1999, the General Council saw the need to coordinate the activities of professional surveyors in this field and established the first cross-divisional committee on Property Management (PM). The PM Committee acted as the central source for coordinating activities internally and provided representations in non-government and other bodies related to property management activities. In 2003, the PM Committee was renamed Property and Facility Management (PFM) Committee to embrace the growing importance in the development of facility management both globally and locally. Later in the year, the PFM Committee was reformed to become the Property and Facility Management Forum following the amendment of the HKIS constitution recognising the establishment of specialist forums for cross-divisional and specialised services in the profession. With the hard work of the PFM Forum under the leadership of its chairman, Sr Michael Price and the approval of the General Council, the formation of the Property and Facility Management Division was approved with overwhelming support in the Extraordinary General Meeting held on 18 May 2005.

Property and Facility Management Surveyor

Since the dawn of professional management of the real estate market in Hong Kong in the sixties, Property and Facility Management Surveyors (PFMS) have been engaged and are employed as estate surveyors, estate director/managers, property managers, maintenance managers, property service managers, facility managers, etc., and provide daily operations and strategic management of properties, assets and estates to the clients in both public and private sectors. PFMS has also contributed to the professionalism, quality and excellence of the property management of governmental, corporate and private commercial, residential and industrial buildings, as well as shopping malls and other facilities.

PFMS in Hong Kong are widely recognized both locally and internationally as experts in the real estate and construction industry and their responsibilities are wide ranging and include strategic facility planning, asset management, space planning management, real estate design and management, operation and maintenance, property management, corporate real estate and related services. Confined by the rules of professional standards, PFMS capitalize their professional knowledge as well as relevant experiences and play an advisory role in various stages of the real estate development. At the startup stage, PFMS provides in-depth expert opinions on security, functions, space management, and human resources planning for single and/ or multi-development projects. Following on the consolidation stage, we contribute our experiences and expertise on green management, energy savings, air quality improvements, environmental education, sustainable development, and control. At the expansion stage, we provide a promotional platform for green management initiatives through educational activities and exercises on ideas and good practice exchanges so as to contribute to the sustainable development of the Hong Kong built environment.

Area of Specialization

Property and Facility Management Surveyors are employed in over 140 organizations spreading across 10 different sectors including the government, government agencies, public corporations, developers, property and facilities management services providers, multi-national companies, international real estate consultants in the provision of professional services as follows:

1. Property Asset Management

Property Asset Management is the comprehensive management of real estate assets from acquisition, marketing, leasing, property management (including renovation, improvement and production of complex financial packages and projections) through to disposal. Depending on the nature and scale of the asset, this may involve management of extensive facilities including auditorium, theatre, meeting rooms, club house with full range of recreation facilities, business centre, serviced apartments, canteen etc. The ability of Property and Facility Management Surveyors will provide a caring service to the users, offer innovative value added services and to manage such facilities in a cost effective manner using state of the art technologies is essential.

About Property and Facility Management Division

2. Corporate Real Estate

Space and premises are the inseparable parts of the business operation of a corporation. The strategic and effective management of business space and premises will impact on competitiveness and productivity of the corporation. Property and Facility Management Surveyors are employed with major space users or international real estate consultants to take up responsibility in the global and local strategic space planning, research and business relocation planning. They will assist in the acquisition of space and premises, valuation and agreement on terms.

3. Project Management

Project management for property facilities is the application of managerial knowledge and professional expertise to complete project activities relating to the built environment and to meet or exceed the satisfaction of all stakeholders as a whole. The major incumbents include but not limited to offering professional advice on the feasibility study, desktop design, program, procurement options, constructability, quality control and the final deliverables throughout the project life cycle from the initiating, planning, executing, controlling until the final closing-off.

4. Property Management

Property and Facility Management Surveyors as Property Managers have the overall responsibility for up-keeping the standard and enhancing the asset value of their managed properties. They should maintain the properties in a sound and safe condition. Well planned maintenance schedules can help to upkeep the facilities of the building well so as to maintain the building quality standard. Ongoing renovation, improvement and statutory alteration are the keys to allow the properties held for investment purpose to compete with other newly built buildings.

Training and competencies

After obtaining the relevant academic qualification, candidates, who are interested in becoming PFMS, are required to undergo at least 400 days of recognized professional training in order to acquire the required level of professional competence in three major areas of competencies.

In the area of Mandatory Competencies, candidates are expected to achieve general knowledge and understanding in all of the following Core Skills: Ethics, knowledge of HKIS structure, rules and regulations; Basic business & communication skills, self-management, customer care; Information technology, analysis of information and data; Law, dispute resolution and conflict avoidance; and Health, Safety and Environmental Awareness. They are also required to acquire general knowledge and understanding in all of the following Others Skills: Business management, Organizational Leadership, Negotiation Skills; Management of People and Resources, Recruitment and Selection; and Accounting Principles and Procedures.


Candidates may choose two out of the following four Core Competencies and engage themselves in such breadth and depth in knowledge application and analysis with the ability to give advice. These competencies are grouped under Property Asset Management, Corporate Real Estate, Project Management, and Property Management.

Finally candidates are required to achieve general knowledge and understanding in two of the following five Non-Core Competencies: Finance Management, Human Resources and Organization Management, Information Technology and Communication Management, Quality and Performance Management and Benchmarking, and Major Research.

Development of the Profession

For the growth and development of the profession, Property and Facility Management Division would closely monitoring on the regulation of the property management industry and review of related government ordinances. It is considered that the pre-requisites on academic and professional qualifications for the registration of property management practitioners would have deep impact to the career development of PFMS in the long run, therefore, the division took the opportunity to raise our concerns towards the licensing of Property Management Companies and practitioners. Besides, we have further established a closer relationship and co-operation with our China counterparts in Beijing, Shanghai and Guangdong. Closer ties with the local and Mainland China open up opportunities to raise the recognition of our profession.

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






■ ABSTRACT

He has co-authored two books and has contributed to chapters of several other books and has published papers in the areas of building quality and performance assessment, sustainable development and heritage, facility management benchmarking, development control, and the durability of building materials. Sr Dr HO has served on various government committees, councils, and boards of professional institutions, including the Authorized Persons' and Registered Structural Engineers' Disciplinary Board Panel, and the Appeal Tribunal Panel, under the Buildings Ordinance (Cap. 123), etc.

Dr Liusman is a lecturer in the School of Hotel and Tourism Management at The Chinese University of Hong Kong. She currently teaches Shopping Mall Investment and Management. She has undertaken research on land supply restriction, residential real estate, commercial real estate, property management, urban renewal and heritage sustainability.

ABSTRACT

The services of property management companies (PMCs) are crucial in ensuring health and safety of occupants in multi-owned high-rise flats due to the complex nature of ownership and interactions of various stakeholders. The maintenance and management of high-rise flats includes those for common areas such as lifts, staircases, lobbies, etc. together with building security, repairs, landscaping, expenditure, and budgeting issues. All these issues combined with the different background of owners have given rise to the needs of building management and PMC's services. Yet, the performance of PMCs varies. Using the logic model as the contextual framework with indicators adapted from the Building Quality Index (BQI), we attempt to measure the performance of PMCs in managing highrise flats. A total of 41 high-rise flats are sampled in our pilot study. Our study shows that the performance of PMCs varies significantly. In addition, the same PMC is likely to generate different performance outcomes due to unique building characteristics. The outputs, building ages, and rehabilitation statuses were the contributing factors to PMCs' performance outcomes. Practically the model can be used by PMCs to review their current performance. This may facilitate the development of a strategy to enhance the health and safety standards of high-rise flats under their management.

Ms Hui is currently Under Secretary for Home Affairs of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government. The key policy areas covered by the bureau include culture and sports, district administration, youth development and social enterprises.

Prior to joining Government, Florence was Head of Business Planning and Development for North Asia of Standard Chartered PLC, responsible for strategy development and corporate governance. Before Standard Chartered, she was management consultant with McKinsey & Company, advising international and regional corporations on market entry and growth strategy, organisational restructuring and process reengineering.

While at the bank, Florence served the banking industry as Secretary for the Hong Kong Association of Banks in 2007 and was Part-Time Member of Government's Central Policy Unit in 2008.

Florence graduated from the Chinese University of Hong Kong and Cambridge University in the UK. She further completed executive programmes at Harvard Business School and Tsinghua University. Her interests include reading, travel, the arts and green living. She is married with two daughters.

■ ABSTRACT

Social Enterprises (SEs) in Hong Kong have been developing steadily after years of concerted efforts across the community and the Government has been committed to promoting its development. Today the number of SEs in Hong Kong has increased from about 260 in 2008 to more than 450. The sector has shown growing diversity in both the scope of services provided and its service targets. With cross-sector collaboration, the number of SE platforms and supporting organisations has exceeded 30. There has also been an increase in the public awareness of SEs with nearly 80% of survey respondents being familiar with SEs and about 70% of them indicating an interest to procure services or products provided by SEs in future.

The Government will continue to facilitate the development of SEs through a broad range of support services, including funding schemes for individual projects, assistance in capacity building for the sector, and initiatives to raise public awareness and further cross-sector collaboration. The Self-reliance Through District Partnership Programme under HAB has approved grants of around \$180 million for 161 SE projects since its launch in 2006. A total of 2 600 jobs have been created of which 80% were for the socially disadvantaged. After the funding period around 80% of the SEs are still in operation. To help nurture young social entrepreneurs for Hong Kong, we will also work with the community to support programmes to promote SEs among our younger generation.

Ms Wong first joined the Government in July 1979 as an Executive Officer and was appointed to the Administrative Service in September in the same year. She has served in various bureaux and departments, the recent postings include Deputy Secretary for the Civil Service and the Director of Leisure and Cultural Services Department. She has taken up the position of Permanent Secretary for the Environment and Director of Environmental Protection since September 2006. ■ ABSTRACT

Eco property management – partnership for sustainable development

- 1. Hong Kong has approximately 2.6 million residential flats and over 43 million m² of non-domestic floor space, which provide a valuable opportunity for promoting green building and sustainable property management practices.
- 2. The promotion of green building and sustainable property management practice is a multi-faceted and diverse subject. It involves a wide range of issues covering both the hardware and the management aspects. The hardware aspects are by nature more visible. Examples of conservation of resources in building design and installations are plenty, ranging from incorporation of energy saving and renewable energy devices; the provision of waste recycling and recovery facilities; to green roof and vertical greening, etc. Indeed these features are becoming more popular in new buildings and facilities. On the management aspects, I am pleased to see wider adoption of green management practices in building and facility management. Amongst various measures, the appointment of green managers and energy wardens to implement green housekeeping programmes and to drive behavioural change among the building occupants can help oversee the progress of the green measures and the environmental performance of the buildings and facilities concerned. Participation in the Hong Kong Awards for Environmental Excellence also serves as an excellent opportunity for mobilizing concerted efforts of all parties concerned towards the goal of attaining the best practices in the industry. Benchmarking the achievements made amongst peers also creates an incentive for sustaining the high quality of green management
- 3. Surveyors have a key and strategic role to play in driving the green movement in the building sector as they act as the link between the building owners and the occupants. I am encouraged by HKIS' positive interest in driving sustainable property and facility management services. This drive echoes the vision of the Government to develop Hong Kong into a city of low-carbon and sustainable development. I look forward to further collaboration and exchange between the Environment Bureau and the HKIS for developing and promoting relevant best practice guidelines to raise awareness and broaden adoption of these measures in the community.

■ ABSTRACT

Sustainability is a hot topic in the arena of FM. However, it is always being mistaken to be associated with high cost or sacrifice of quality for environmental friendly products. However, the real case may be completely different. The FM team at the Hong Kong Science Park had practiced Holistic FM to achieve a sustainable and quality outcome.

In the Holistic FM approach, FM starts from the drawing board before the construction of the built asset. FM is involved in the planning and design stage, through the construction stage, then into the operation and maintenance stage of the building life cycle. Modern and innovative technologies in couple with total life cycle methodologies was employed by the Hong Kong Science Park FM team to achieve quality and sustainable result with good cost saving.

This presentation will share with the audience the practical methodologies to realize sustainable and quality performance and at the same time to have a good financial performance. Tips for successful FM practice will be demonstrated with proven examples in the Holistic FM approach of the Hong Kong Science Park

Sr Hui is a professional building surveyor with extensive experience in building control and the administration of the Buildings Ordinance. He joined the then Buildings Ordinance Office (now the Buildings Department) in 1978.

Sr Hui has been the Director of Buildings since March 2014.

He is a member of the Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors.

■ ABSTRACT

There are several generations of the Buildings Ordinance since its introduction in 1856¹. The objective of maintaining public health within the building control ambit could be traced back to the Public Health and Buildings Ordinance 1903. However, healthy buildings should go beyond the prescriptive requirements under the Ordinance. In this regard, what are the essential elements in defining "Healthy Buildings"? What are the minimum requirements for a healthy building? What further control other than that prescribed under the Buildings Ordinance (Cap. 123) should be imposed for a healthy building? What will happen if the building is not healthy?

Stakeholders in maintaining a healthy building should definitely include those participated in the design, construction and operation of the buildings. But, do they always share the same goal? Are there other parties playing a significant role in the field? Is there any means to align these stakeholders to achieve the common goal? What is the role of the Building Authority and the Buildings Department in ensuring a healthy built environment? What will happen if the stakeholders are not sharing the same objective towards a healthy built environment?

The occupation and operation of a building constitutes over 90% of its life time. A healthy building at design and construction stage can retain its original performance only if proper management and maintenance is made continuously. How can we maintain a healthy building effectively? If a building was not built with the consideration to strive for the highest level of healthy state, could it ever become a healthy building? What are the roles of the owners, occupants and property managers in this regard? What are the differences if P&FM Surveyors are participating in the management and maintenance of the building? What might happen if there are no P&FM Surveyors?

The speaker will share his experience from the perspective of building control with the audience with a view to stimulating ideas on the above questions and deriving a pathway towards a healthy built environment.

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









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
