

Message from the President

The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors

The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors was formed on 26 April 1984, with just 85 professional members. Today, we number over 10,000 members. It goes without saying that a tremendous amount of hard work and determination was necessary to get us to where we are today. As the HKIS celebrates its 35th anniversary, members may remember that their sustained passion and diligence can explain everything it has achieved over the past three and a half decades.

It is my great honour to serve as your President at this pivotal juncture. Now I consider it is necessary to look both forward to the future and backwards to see how far the Institute has come. There are a huge list of acknowledgements that need to be made, and this commentary cannot name them all. So let me begin by paying tribute to each of those 85 initial members, who recognised the need and staked their claim by establishing the HKIS. Hong Kong was very different back in 1984, and it's important to realise the brave step they took.

I would also like to pay the heartiest of tributes to all of my predecessors as President. Every single past president deserves the utmost respect and gratitude of members for unrelentingly guiding the Institute forward.

The HKIS's recent achievements especially deserve to be applauded. In the five years that have passed since celebrating our 30th anniversary, the institute has been at the forefront of an international effort to set standards for the surveying profession. In late 2014 we signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the International Valuation Standards Council (IVSC) on the development and promotion of global valuation standards, and in the following summer, the HKIS became a member of the International Construction Measurement Standards (ICMS) Coalition.

In promoting young talent and securing the future of the surveying profession, the Institute made a huge step forward last year by introducing the HKIS Mentorship Programme. The opportunity to enjoy learned counsel attracted an overwhelming response from future surveyors who currently study at Hong Kong's universities, and will enjoy the support and expertise of the Institute's senior members as they plan for their future careers.

Last, but not least, we also celebrate this month the fifth anniversary of the HKIS Charitable Foundation, which was incorporated on 9 April 2014. The foundation aims to promote education, provide poverty relief and support the underprivileged, aged, socially disadvantaged and vulnerable groups in the community.

Looking ahead, the integration opportunities presented by both the Belt and Road Initiative and Greater Bay Area integration continue to bring growing potential to the surveying industry, and enjoying these fruits remains our top professional priority. I also look forward to strengthening the relationships between local and overseas industry professionals and related organisations, while enhancing the professional status of the HKIS internationally.

Moving ahead, I also look forward to establishing closer ties with our members, especially those who are new to the profession. The Institute will continue to work hard to nurture new blood in the surveying industry, and encourage the younger generation to participate in the HKIS.

Everything the HKIS has achieved over the past 35 years has been shaped by a few simple principles that will continue to guide HKIS in the years ahead – "Engage, Mentor, Growth and Connect". These are principles that will remain as relevant 35 years from now as they do today.







About the HKIS

The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors ('HKIS' or 'the Institute') was founded in April 1984 and had 85 founding members. The Institute was statutorily incorporated by virtue of the Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors Ordinance in January 1990 (Cap. 1148). In July 1991, the Surveyors Registration Ordinance (Cap. 417) was passed and a Registration Board was set up to administer the registration of surveyors.

The work of the HKIS includes setting standards for professional services and performance, establishing codes of ethics, determining requirements for admission as professional surveyors, and encouraging members to upgrade skills through continuing professional development.

The Institute plays an important role from time to time in giving advice to the Government on issues such as land supply, unauthorised building works, building safety campaign, property management, town planning and development strategies, construction quality and housing.

The HKIS membership has now grown to over 10,000. As of April 2019, the number of members reached 10,464 including 6,891 Corporate Members consisting Fellows and Members - distinguished by the initials FHKIS and MHKIS; 77 Associate Members distinguished by the initials AMHKIS; and 3,496 probationers and student members.

To qualify as a Corporate Member of the Institute, surveyors must possess a recognised academic qualification; complete supervised professional training within strict guidelines for a minimum period of 24 months, followed by an Assessment of Professional Competence (APC).

The title "Surveyor" embraces a number of disciplines involved with land and its development with land and buildings, covering an extremely wide scope. Some surveyors work in private practices and others may work for a landowner, developer, building contractor or government departments and related bodies.

The Institute consists of six divisions and one Young Surveyors Group:

- Building Surveying Division
- General Practice Division
- Land Surveying Division
- Planning and Development Division
- Property and Facility Management Division
- Quantity Surveying Division

A land surveyor measures and records the shape and position of the land, defines the boundary and sets out the legal boundaries of the sites. A general practice surveyor advises on the best use of the land, assesses the feasibility and viability of the proposed development project as well as the valuation, marketing, sale, leasing and management of completed developments. A planning and development surveyor further advises on the possible change of zoning, the likely environmental impacts and makes suggestions on preliminary development contents. A quantity surveyor is concerned with the building contractual arrangements and cost control, and will evaluate the likely cost of the development project and advise on the most suitable kind of contract for the project. A building surveyor is involved in the project management of building development proposal, holistic maintenance management of building and overall control of private buildings under relevant legislation. A property and facility management surveyor provides a comprehensive range of services in real estate management.

About the HKIS

The Institute has established and continues to expand its presence in the international scene through participation in various international platforms as well as reciprocity relationships with other national surveying bodies and through membership in relevant world bodies and international organisations to maintain its professional edge at international level. The Institute is one of the three founding members, apart from the Singapore Institute of Surveyors and the Institution of Surveyors, Malaysia, of the Surveyors' Alliance Asia which was inaugurated in November 2004.





Building Surveying Division

It is my greatest pleasure to share with you some developmental milestones of the Building Surveying Division (BSD) in the past 35

Firstly, I would like to express my sincerest gratitude to the great contributions of all previous chairmen, council members, coopt members and APC assessors in the past 35 years. We have made a lot of achievements. The total number of our divisional corporate membership increased from 65 in Year 1984 to 1322 in Year 2019.

Building Surveying Voluntary Team SARS Infection

The BSD actively involved in media interviews, press conferences, public road shows and talks during and after the SARS period. A Building Surveying Voluntary Team (BSVT) was formed to offer free survey to the drainage systems of ten residential buildings. The survey findings and our recommendation on the 'Design of sewerage system of residential buildings in Hong Kong to prevent future recurrence of outbreak of infection diseases including Atypical Pneumonia' were presented in the joint meeting of the Panel on Housing and Panel on Planning, Lands & Works of the Legislative Council on 16 May 2003 followed by a written submission to the Buildings Department. The layman guide "Drainage Maintenance Booklet" was published in June 2003.

Collapse Incident of No. 45J Ma Tau Wai Road

A three-month Voluntary Building Inspection Scheme was announced on 5 February 2010 after the incident. 107 enquiries were handled and inspections to 28 buildings were conducted. The services provided the owners of residential buildings aged between 30 and 50 years with a basic idea on the overall condition of their flats and the common areas of the buildings inspected. The survey findings were announced in the press conference on 29 June 2010.

Collapse Incident of Steel Space Truss Roof in the Hu Fa Kuang Sports Centre of the City University of Hong Kong

Following the incident on 20 May 2016, the BSD held a press conference on 25 May 2016 to emphasize the importance of proper design, planning, execution and caring of green roof. The BVST was also called upon for providing professional advice on rooftop design and building conditions to schools and charitable organisations. The team in joint force with the Hong Kong Institute of Landscape Architects, who provided advice on landscape matters, completed 28 inspections.

Affordable Shared Housing Project

BSVT conducted preliminary condition surveys to more than 100 potential domestic flats for the "Community Housing Movement" of the Hong Kong Council of Social Services to identify suitable flats for renovation to shared housing throughout January to March 2018 and December 2018. The inspections covered several aspects including structure, water seepage, drainage, unauthorised building works (UBWs) and means of escape, etc.

Mutual Recognition Agreement with the China Association of Engineering Consultants (CAEC)

The agreement on mutual recognition of qualifications was signed in Beijing on 27 June 2006. The agreement allowed a onetime reciprocity arrangement for members of both sides to obtain qualification of the other side through training and assessments. Since then, over 200 Building Surveyor (BS) members have obtained CAEC qualifications. With the increasing opportunities to work in the Greater Bay Area and One Belt One Road scheme, the BSD has proposed the launching of the second mutual recognition with a draft agreement prepared for further action.

Building Repair and Maintenance Authority (BRMA)

There has been a rising number of complaints about tender bid rigging, unreasonably high tender price, poor works quality and consultancy services, and even nuisances and threats in some extreme cases in the building maintenance and repair works

industry. The BSD proposed to establish a BRMA to regulate the market and practitioners in 2014. The Urban Renewal Authority (URA) has made reference to this proposal and set up a Building Rehabilitation Platform, which will commence its services by phases starting in early 2019. It should be regarded as a starting line of BRMA.

Building Surveyors Awards (BSA)

BSA was first launched in 2015 to enhance public recognition to preeminent projects. This biennial award is one of the most prestigious honours in the building surveying profession. The award presentation ceremony of the 3rd BSA will be held on 14 June 2019.

Joint Research with the Guangdong Province Association of Engineering Consultants (GPAEC)

The Division is working on a joint research with the GPAEC on "工程監理在粵港合作中相關法律法規差異性研究一以粵港維修市場為例" which aims to explore the chances of introducing a systematic building maintenance strategy to Guangdong's existing buildings. With the professional experience in planned maintenance, we believe our BS would have vast job opportunities in the building maintenance market in the Mainland.

Building Affairs Expert Determination Centre (BAEDC)

The BSD proposed to set up the BAEDC as a supplementary avenue to the existing litigation and other alternative dispute resolution systems, in particular, for building-related technical issues and disputes such as water seepage, workmanship of decoration, fitting out, repair and maintenance works for existing buildings. It aims to initiate an easily accessible and affordable platform to the general public. The initiative was submitted to the Chief Executive in the "HKIS Views to 2018 Policy Address". The detailed mechanism is being formulated.

Pre-acquisition Survey for Second-Hand Domestic Premises

With the aim of promoting building safety and elimination of unauthorised building works in the long run, the BSD suggested to implement a pre-acquisition survey of second-hand domestic premises in which buyers of second-hand domestic premises should appoint authorised persons/registered professional BS to survey these properties before completing their purchases. The proposal was issued to the Financial Secretary on 6 February 2019. The BSD is closely following up on the development of the proposal.

The Way Forward

The BSD will continue to strengthen members' professional competence, promote BS expertise and maintain close communications with our members, the Government and counterparts in the industry. We will take active role in responding to building-related issues, channeling our views and recommendations to the stakeholders to promote a healthy and safe living environment.

Our members possess well-versed knowledge in building survey, building-related legislations, contractual arrangement, building development potential, project planning and design, building technology and maintenance. We are competent to deliver complete building solutions. We involved in all stages of the building development process from inception to completion and maintenance of the buildings throughout their life cycle. We are available to provide tailor-made services to our clients and the public for both existing buildings and new development projects.

I am pleased to share with you some developmental milestones of the General Practice Division in the past 35 years, that continues to offer professional and skilled services to various area of our industry.

Successfully enhancing our professional recognition

With the recent development potential of the "Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area" Strategy, Hong Kong has been identified as an international financial centre. Our city has long nurtured numerous professional talents in fields such as finance, law, and surveying. Over the years we have made every endeavor to promote the competitiveness of our professional members. Last February, the General Practice Division has successfully accomplished the third reciprocity arrangement event with the China Institute of Real Estate Appraisers and Agents ("CIREA"), bringing up more potential opportunities for General Practice surveyors through cooperation. The first Reciprocity Recognition was accomplished in 2004. 97 General Practice Surveyors and 111 of Mainland China's Real Estate Appraisers have established mutual recognition and the arrangement was known as the earliest case of mutual recognition of professional qualification under CEPA. Over the past 15 years, 276 of our members have attained the CIREA qualification and 300 of Mainland's Real Estate Appraisers have attained Hong Kong's certification under three batches of reciprocity arrangements. Guangdong Province is a noticeably important origin of international contractor investment. With Hong Kong's extensive development of professional services, we can assist corporations in the Greater Bay Area to participate in infrastructure projects under the "Belt and Road Initiative" and provide relevant planning, consultation and supervision services.

Furthermore, and after more than a year of negotiation, there is now a mutual recognition of membership between HKIS and RICS, allowing for a streamlined application process for professional qualifications, enabling surveyors to gain hands-on experience in the market and enhance global recognition. With the accumulation of international talent in Hong Kong, we anticipate further integration into the Greater Bay Area, helping to satisfy the growing demand of professionals and providing quality services to corporations on the international stage.

The HKIS Valuation Standards 2017 came into effect on 30 December 2017 and follows a review of the 2012 edition initiated by the GPD Council. Bringing the HKIS Standards in line with the two newly launched standards of IVS 2017 and RICS Valuation -Global Standards 2017 and applying to all members and valuation reports, the new Standards ensure that the services carried out by General Practice Surveyors are professional and consistent.

Embracing the challenges and seizing future opportunities

The Greater Bay Area has become a prominent national strategy of economic development. With a population of over 69 million and GDP of over 1.5 trillion USD, the Greater Bay Area will play a crucial role in future economic development. The Central Government demonstrated its commitment to the "Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area" by announcing the Outline Development Plan on 18 February 2019. In early March, the Central government introduced the eight policy measures for propelling the Greater Bay Development. These measures could enable Hong Kong residents to develop, work and reside in cities of the Greater Bay Area, as well as promote the convenient flow of people and goods across cities. In the era of globalisation, Hong Kong has long been specialised in particular industries. To facilitate the diversified industrial structure, Hong Kong has to reaffirm the division of work with other Mainland Cities and complement each other. Throughout the integration process of cities, youth in Hong Kong should not constrain their opportunities in Hong Kong only, but also the Greater Bay Area or the Greater China Region.

Being the third largest international financial centre, Hong Kong's advantages of free capital flows, low tax rate and the role of Renminbi offshore business centre will enable us to become the financing node for corporates from Belt and Road Countries.

By providing appropriate platforms and opportunities, youth in Hong Kong can benefit from endless possibilities and potential. Teenagers are passionate with dreams; it is of paramount importance to understand the overall national development. Being a crucial pivot of the "Belt and Roads Initiative", the Greater Bay Area aims at developing an interdependent city-region like the New York Bay Area. With the completion of Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macau Bridge and the Express-Rail, the intercity connections between the Greater Bay Area cities have become more convenient. It is my greatest pleasure to share with you some milestones of the Land Surveying Division in the HKIS 35th Anniversary.

At the outset, I would like to express my most sincere gratitude to all previous council members and the divisional members in the past 35 years for the great contributions toward the prosperous development of the HKIS. Those achievements are remarkable in various areas including Internal Affairs, External Affairs, Local Affairs and Professional Standards in the history.

History of Land Surveying Profession in Hong Kong

In 1970s, a group of both local and expatriate professional land surveyors decided to provide a professional forum for all land surveyors in Hong Kong, and thus they established the Hong Kong Institute of Land Surveyors (HKILS) in 1976.

In 1984, HKILS was formally recognised by the government as the only professional body representing the professional land surveyors. HKIS was also formally recognised by the government the next year. Corporate membership of the HKIS had also been recognised as a suitable qualification for appointment to the relevant grades and post in the civil service. The increase in the number of land surveyors joining HKIS eventually led HKILS to amalgamate with HKIS in 1991. In the same year, with the effort of land surveyors to strive for a local land surveying degree course, the Hong Kong Polytechnic (now known as the Hong Kong Polytechnic University) had successfully started a degree course in land surveying.

In 1994, the first batch of graduates in Land Surveying and Geo-informatics was produced.

Internal Affairs

The Division has been organising various Continuing Professional Development ("CPD") and Pre-Qualification Structural Learning (PQSL) sessions and events every year. Moreover, technical visits to and joint conferences with our mainland counterparts in Beijing, Taiwan, Guangdong province, Xiamen, Hong Kong and Macau would be conducted every year to broaden members' knowledge.

In 2011, a new APC scheme was introduced to recognise the importance of professional knowledge in some specific areas and, as such, probationers undergoing the APC will have to attain the requisite standards in a more structured way.

In 2018, LSD Education Council (LSDEC) adopted a training period for post qualification experience, as provided by the ICES for professional training and HKIES for technical training, during the LSD membership training period to absorb more associate and corporate members.

External Affairs

The Division has made a lot of achievements in this area. We have established good relationships with various international and mainland surveying organisations. We signed mutual recognition agreements with them such as the Chartered Institute of Civil Engineering Surveyors (ICES).

We also actively participated in conferences/seminars organised by overseas and mainland surveying organisations to promote the HKIS and the LSD and to exchange views on various surveying issues, including FIG Congress and Working Week, Cross-Strait Geomatics Conference, Beijing-HK-Macau Geomatics Conference, etc.

A new form of mutual recognition of membership at the divisional level between the LSD and RICS has been introduced in 2017.

Land Surveying Division

Local Affairs

With regard to the local affairs, the LSD has contributed a lot to the community and the surveying profession in Hong Kong. For the development of Hong Kong, we have been involved in various legislations which particularly relate to the aspects of land survey, control of standard of land boundary survey, preparation of plan and registration of land surveyors. They provide the society with a better living environment.

LSD has strived for conveying the contribution of professional land surveyor in various scales of construction projects. More land surveying posts has been created in the Central/Wanchai Bypass, Chek Lap Kok Link, Liantang/Heung Yuen Wai Boundary Control Point, and HK-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge HKBCF etc.

Professional Standards

To meet the increasing need for land surveying services, the Division has set up various committees, such as Boundary Survey Advisory Committee (BSAC), to cope with the drastic changes in the emerging market. To help emphasise the commitment of HKIS in ensuring integrity, ethical conduct of members, the LSD monitors closely the qualifications and standards of members as well as the practices in the industry.

The Way Forward

Land surveyors have mastered in smart city applications, including 3D modelling, remote sensing, UAVs, and BIM, to make great contributions to future smart cities. All Corporate Members and Associate Members of the LSD shall maintain a high level of competence in professional practice and technical performance and are obliged to undertake continuing professional development and lifelong learning to enhance their professional and technical competence. All Members, Probationers and Technical Trainees shall endeavour to achieve a high level of competence in performance and are obliged to undertake the pre-qualification structured learning.

Planning & Development (P&D) surveyors have a long history in the United Kingdom. When the Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors was formed in 1984, its constitution has a provision to form and establish a P&D Surveying Division (PDD). On 2 June 2004, P&D Provisional Council was established.

Two Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) have been signed between PDD and Guangdong City Planning Association (GCPA) and the Singapore Institute of Planners (SIP) on 20 March and 18 October 2018 respectively.

With the sharing of successful planning and management experience as the key area of cooperation, our alliance will lay a foundation for further cooperation between Hong Kong and Guangdong as well as Singapore in the planning and development field under the initiative of the Greater Bay Area and One Belt One Road. Moreover, to promote ongoing knowledge exchange, we will support each other in various activities in the future. It is hope that the regular exchange of planning experiences would help facilitating the sustainable growth of our cities.

Proposed Recognition of P&D Surveyors in Government Posts

We aim to expand the roles of planning and development surveyors in both the private and public sectors, PDD has expressed to the Civil Service Bureau the need of including members of the planning and development division in the selection of government posts such as Planners of the Planning Department and Property Agencies of the Rating and Valuation Department. P&D surveyors have a wider scope of training in theories and practices compared with single stream surveyors, which is an advantage to serve the public sector comprehensively.

Internal Affairs

HKU Urban Planning Course for HKIS Members

PDD has successfully negotiated with the Department of Urban Planning and Design, HKU to offer seats for our members in the course "Planning Practice, Law and Ethics in Hong Kong". This course is open to all HKIS Corporate Members who have proven development experience but do not have planning practice and experience in Hong Kong. While admitting members through the multiple membership route, higher preference would be given to those Corporate Members who have proven development experience and completed this planning course.

CPDs on Different Aspects and Exploration on Our Country's Developments

PDD has organised various CPDs and site visits, with particular focus on the development of the Greater Bay Area, Belt and Road Initiative and other professional knowledge such as brownfield development, business accounting and finance for Hong Kong surveyors and application of spatial data infrastructure in a smart city.

Course Accreditation from Local Universities

Currently, PDD has recognised the BSc in Urban Studies, BSc in Surveying and MSC in Real Estate courses offered by HKU and Graduates will be eligible to take the P&D APC Exam in accordance with the established P&D APC Guidelines. As for the MSc (Urban Planning) graduates, upon completion of prescribed top-up courses to be offered by the Faculty, they will also be eligible to take the P&D APC Examination.

PDD will continue to maintain close communication with education institutions such as the Chinese University of Hong Kong, The Hong Kong Polytechnic University, City University of Hong Kong and THEi to understand their programme details and offer accreditation whenever appropriate.

Meeting with President Xi for the 40th Anniversary of China's Economic Reforms and Opening-up

Together with members of various sectors of the community who have made profound contributions to Hong Kong and to the reforms and opening-up of China, our Founding Chairman, Sr Edwin Tsang, got to meet with President Xi Jinping and Vice Premier of the State Council Mr Han Zheng. He sat to the right with two other distinguished surveyors, Sr Francis Lau Shiu-kwan and the Hon Sr CY Leung (Vice Chairman of the National Political Consultative Conference), who sat in the middle of the first row. To recognise the tremendous contributions made by Sr Tsang during China's modernisation and the one country, two systems principle, Sr Tsang had great honor to shake hand with President Xi.

Support Our Young Professionals, Probationers and Student Members

Our council guides the career path of our student members and probationers, PDD has not only organised a series of career talks, introducing the professional services provided by P&D surveyors, but also offered them adequate mentoring support and internship opportunities.

Way Forward

Driven by the Greater Bay Area Development Plan, the Belt and Road Initiative and the Hong Kong 2030+, there has been a growing demand for developing land for housing, urban renewal and new town development. The roles of the planning and development surveyors are getting more and more important to plan and identify the potential uses of lands, optimise the land use planning and overall manage the development process. Further negotiations with government bodies will be continued to strive for more job opportunities for PDD surveyors in the public sector.

PDD looks forward to organising more CPDs related to the Greater Bay Area and the Belt and Road Initiative to provide platforms for members to fully understand the potential and opportunities of this massive regional development.

Last but not least, I would like to take this opportunity to express my sincere thanks to the contribution and hard work from the PDD past chairmen.

HKIS Annual Dinner 2018

In 1999, the General Council saw the need to coordinate the activities of professional surveyors in property and facility management field and established the first cross-divisional committee on Property Management (PM). The PM Committee acted as the central source for coordinating activities internally and provided representations outside government and in other bodies related to property management activities. In 2003, the PM Committee was renamed Property and Facility Management (PFM) Committee to embrace the growing demand in the development of facility management both globally and locally. Later in the year, the PFM Committee was reformed to become the PFM Forum following the amendment of the HKIS Constitution recognising the establishment of specialist forums for cross-divisional and specialised services in the profession. The formation of the PFM Division was approved by the General Council with overwhelming support in the Extraordinary General Meeting held on 18 May 2005.

Property and Facility Management Surveyors

Property and Facility Management Surveyors (PFMS) have been engaged and are employed as estate surveyors, estate director/ managers, property managers, maintenance managers, property service managers, facility managers, etc., and provide daily operations and strategic management of properties, assets and estates to the clients in both public and private sectors. PFMS has also contributed to the professionalism, quality and excellence of the property management of governmental, corporate and private commercial, residential and industrial buildings, as well as shopping malls and other facilities.

PFMS in Hong Kong are widely recognised both locally and internationally as experts in the real estate and construction industry and their responsibilities are wide ranging and include strategic facility planning, asset management, space planning management, real estate design and management, operation and maintenance, property management, corporate real estate and related services.

Areas of Specialisation

PFMS provide the following professional services:

1. **Property Asset Management**

Property Asset Management is the comprehensive management of real estate assets from acquisition, marketing, leasing, property management (including renovation, improvement and production of complex financial packages and projections) through to disposal. Depending on the nature and scale of the asset, this may involve management of extensive facilities including auditorium, theatre, meeting rooms, club house with full range of recreation facilities, business centre, serviced apartments, canteen etc. The ability of Property and Facility Management Surveyors will provide a caring service to the users, offer innovative value added services and manage such facilities in a cost effective manner using state of the art technologies.

2. Corporate Real Estate

Space and premises are the inseparable parts of the business operation of a corporation. The strategic and effective management of business space and premises will impact on competitiveness and productivity of the corporation. PFMS are employed with major space users or international real estate consultants to take up responsibility in the global and local strategic space planning, research and business relocation planning. They will assist in the acquisition of space and premises, valuation and agreement on terms.

3. **Project Management**

Project management for property facilities is the application of managerial knowledge and professional expertise to complete project activities relating to the built environment and to meet or exceed the satisfaction of all stakeholders as a whole. The major incumbents include but not limited to offering professional advice on the feasibility study, desktop design, programme, procurement options, constructability, quality control and the final deliverables throughout the project life cycle from initiating, planning, executing, controlling until final closing-off.

4. Repair and Maintenance

Timely repair and maintenance can enhance the value of the properties and facilities, PFMS are knowledgeable to maintain the properties in a sound and safe condition. Well planned maintenance schedules can help to upkeep the facilities of the building well so as to maintain the building quality standard. Ongoing renovation, improvement and statutory alteration are the keys to allow the properties held for investment purpose to compete with other newly built buildings.

5. **Property Management**

PFMS as Property Managers have the overall responsibility for up-keeping the security, cleaning and landscaping standard and enhancing the asset value of their managed properties.

Development of the Profession

For the growth and development of the profession, PFM Division would closely monitor the regulation of the property management industry and review related government ordinances. It is considered that the pre-requisites on academic and professional qualifications for the registration of property management practitioners would have deep impact to the career development of PFMS in the long run, therefore, the Division took the opportunity to raise our concerns towards the licensing of Property Management Companies and Practitioners.

35 Years of Professional Development

2019 marks an important milestone of The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors as it celebrates its 35th Anniversary in its history of professional development and its great contributions to the community. I truly believe that the Institute will continue to strive for the excellence in serving the community and playing an important consultative role in government policy making especially on issues relating to property and facility management.

2019 Forum with Property Management Services Authority

1. Introduction

On behalf of the Quantity Surveying Division (QSD), it is my great pleasure to congratulate the Institute on this memorable and joyous occasion to celebrate the 35th Anniversary of its establishment.

2. **History and Changes**

Quantity surveying practice has a long history in Hong Kong. The oldest professional quantity surveying firm has been around for more than 65 years. It is believed that the government hired its first expatriate quantity surveyor even earlier. In the past six decades, the profession has witnessed a number of significant changes.

- The majority of quantity surveyors are now Hong Kong Chinese.
- The proportion of female quantity surveyors has increased drastically.
- The number of local graduates now outweigh the number of overseas graduates.
- Measurement units have changed from imperial to metric.
- The measurement practice has evolved from manual to electronic.
- The role and scope of the services offered by quantity surveyors has been enhanced to keep abreast with the development of the society. In the old days, quantity surveyors worked on building projects only. Today, more are working on civil engineering, mechanical and electrical engineering, renovations, fitting out, and maintenance projects.
- Hong Kong has exported its professional quantity surveying services to other geographical locations, such as the Middle East, Southeast Asia, and Mainland China. It should be noted that quantity surveyors have been working on Mainland projects since the 1980s.

3. **Achievement**

Over the past three decades, the QSD has achieved a number of remarkable feats:

- Signing Reciprocity Agreements with professional institutes overseas, namely the Australian Institute of Quantity Surveyors (AIQS), the Building Surveyors Institute of Japan (BSIJ), the China Engineering Cost Association (CECA), the Chartered Institution of Civil Engineering Surveyors (ICES), the Canadian Institute of Quantity Surveyors (CIQS), the New Zealand Institute of Quantity Surveyors (NZIQS), and the Singapore Institute of Surveyors and Valuers (SISV).
- Joining international quantity surveying and cost engineering organisations, namely the Pacific Association of Quantity Surveyors (PAQS) and the International Cost Engineering Association (ICEC) in 1996.

- Its membership has grown from 71 founding members in 1984 to a staggering 3,177 corporate members as of March 2019.
- Joining the International Construction Measurement Standards Coalition (ICMSC) and took part in developing and implementing the International Construction Measurement Standards which was launched in Vancouver in July 2017.

Practice in the Mainland

By way of a reciprocity agreement with CECA in 2005 and a supplemental agreement in 2009, the HKIS now has 399 quantity surveyors who have qualified as cost engineers in the Mainland. As of today, more than 150 quantity surveyors have successfully registered as cost engineers with the approval of the Ministry of Housing, Urban-Rural Development (MoHURD). Under the Reciprocity Agreement and Supplemental Agreement, the QSD also recommended 497 cost engineers from the Mainland for election as corporate members of the HKIS.

5. The Way Forward

As the Institute's largest division, the QSD will strive for excellence to meet the challenges presented by a changing global economy and advancements in information technology. In the old days, it was focused on quantity as a measurement of its progress. Today, quantity surveyors must equip themselves with modern, sometimes innovative, skills in order to continue as highly valued and renowned professionals in the construction industries of Hong Kong and the Asia Pacific Region.





Social Events




